What's in bloom?

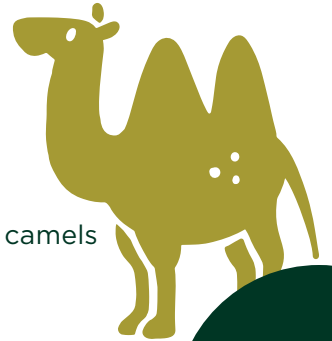
Draw a flower or plant that you find. Can you find its name?
